Outing Leader

at the WLACC University of Scouting

This course is designed for those individuals who wish to learn about the excitement that outdoor activities add to the Scouting program. Here is an opportunity to start building your HAT outdoor skills and leader training. Expand your knowledge of challenges in the outdoors and develop the confidence to safely hike and camp with your unit in the outdoors.

THIS COURSE TRAINS CUB LEADERS ON PROPER OUTING PLANNING AND EXECUTION.

THIS COURSE TRAINS NON-BACKPACKING SCOUT LEADERS FOR ONE-DAY HIKES AND ACTIVITIES AND FOR MULTI-NIGHT CAR-CAMPING EVENTS. This course is a prerequisite for Basic Backpack.

Who should attend: Any registered adult Cub and any registered Scout leaders who organize day hikes and car-camping trips for their unit. Backpacking will not be covered.

Prerequisites: None. Subjects in this course will be covered in the Basic Backpacking Course. This course is required for the Basic Backpack course.

When: January 29, 2011, 9:00 AM to 3:00 PM.

Where: University of Scouting (Pinecrest School, 5975 Shoup St., Woodland Hills, CA.

What to Bring: Scout Uniform Class "A", writing instrument and paper. We will break for the University lunch period from 12:00 P.M. to 1:00 P.M.

Cost: \$10.00 (pay at the class) in addition to the University of Scouting fee.

Winter Awareness Course

This course is designed for those individuals who wish to learn about the excitement that winter activities add to the Scouting programs. Here is an opportunity to build on your HAT outdoor skills and leader training. Expand your knowledge of the challenges with different terrain and develop the confidence to safely hike, backpack and camp in the winter.

The course will cover how to prepare and enjoy camping in the cold weather. Subjects covered will deal with cooking, personal and troop gear, weather, health, safety, and all the other things you need to know in order to plan and conduct a safe, rewarding outing during the winter.

Who should attend: Any registered adult.

Prerequisites: Completion of the High Adventure Basic Backpack Awareness course.

When: Indoor Session: February 5, 2011, 7:30 AM – 5 PM – Council Office.

Outdoor Session: February 26 & 27, 2010 (alternate snow dates, March 12 & 13, 2011

Where: To be determined.

Required to bring:

Indoor Session: Class A uniform, paper, pen or pencil. Parts A & C, medical form. A one hour lunch break will be provided, bring your own lunch or eat out.

Outdoor Session: Class A uniform, meals for Saturday lunch, dinner and Sunday breakfast, tour permit, chair, proper clothing, writing instrument, paper, compass, medications, sunscreen, 10 essentials, canteen, stove, cook kit & utensils, tent and sleeping gear.

Registration cost: Early registration \$25.00 (prior to January 14th),

Standard registration: \$30.00 (paid after January 14th).

Basic Backpacking

This course is designed for those individuals who wish to learn about the excitement that backpacking activities adds to the Scouting programs. Here is an opportunity to build on your HAT outdoor skills and leader training. Expand your knowledge of the challenges with different terrain and develop the confidence to safely hike, backpack and camp with your unit.

The course will cover how to prepare and enjoy backpacking, Subjects covered will deal with map & compass, cooking, personal and troop gear, weather, health, safety, and all the other things you need to know in order to plan and conduct a safe, rewarding outing.

WHO SHOULD TAKE THIS COURSE: The novice will gain his or her first backpacking experience under knowledgeable guidance; the experienced backpacker will learn how to organize a hike for Scouts.

Who should attend: Any registered adult.

Prerequisite: **Outing Leader**, no backpacking experience required.

When: Indoor Session: September 24, 2011. 7:30 AM – 5 PM (Council Office)

Outdoor Session: October 8 & 9, 201 (For LDS October 7 & 8, if requested)

Where: Indoor session at the Council office; outdoor session location to be determined.

Required to bring:

Indoor Session: Class-A uniform, compass, paper, pen or pencil. Parts A & C medical form. A 1 hour lunch break will be provided. Please provide your own lunch. Bring it or Denny's is located nearby.

Outdoor Session: Class A and class B, uniforms. Transportation to and from the outdoor session. Any medications. Hiking clothing appropriate for weather conditions; equipment and items essential for a 2 day backpacking trip, including 10 + Essentials, stove, cook kit & utensils, backpacking tent and sleeping gear, plus three backpack meals for Saturday lunch, dinner and Sunday breakfast.

Registration cost: Early registration \$25.00 (prior to September 9th). Standard registration, \$30.00 (paid after September 9th).

Junior Basic Backpacking

This High Adventure Team course is designed for those youth who wish to learn about the fun that backpacking activities adds to the Scouting programs. Here is an opportunity to build on your outdoor skills and leader training. Expand your knowledge of the challenges with different terrain and develop the confidence to safely hike, backpack and camp with your unit. The course will teach you how to prepare for and enjoy backpacking. The course subjects will teach map & compass, cooking, personal and troop gear, weather, health, safety, and all the other things you need to know in order to plan and conduct a safe, rewarding Troop outing. The Astronomy merit badge may also be earned.

WHO SHOULD TAKE THIS COURSE: The novice will gain his or her first backpacking experience under knowledgeable guidance; the experienced backpacker will learn how to organize a hike for Scouts. Who should attend: Any registered youth. [No registration at the door permitted; Scouts with incomplete forms will be sent home].

Prerequisites: **Must be First Class Rank or above and 13 years or older or Venture Crew member;** no backpacking experience required.

When:

Indoor Session: March 26, 2011, 7:30 AM – 5 PM [the Council Office]

Outdoor Session: May 21-22, 2011, full weekend

Where: Lilly Meadows (Camp Three Falls); parent transportation required.

Required to bring:

Indoor Session: Class A uniform, compass, paper, pen or pencil. A completed consent form and current part A and C medical form is required at the indoor session (no exceptions; parents must stay to take the Scout home until both forms are approved). An hour lunch break will be provided; please bring your own lunch.

Outdoor Session: Class-A uniform, transportation to and from the outdoor session and any medications. Hiking clothing appropriate for weather conditions; equipment and items essential for a 2 day backpacking trip, including 10 + Essentials, stove, cook kit & utensils, backpacking tent and sleeping gear, plus three backpack meals for Saturday lunch, dinner and Sunday breakfast.

Registration cost: Early registration \$25.00 (prior to March 5th), Standard registration \$30.00 (paid after March 5th). This does not include the cost of the food or transportation.

We will also hold an Astronomy class for the Merit Badge that night.

Desert Awareness & Astronomy Awareness

This course is designed for those individuals who wish to learn about the excitement that desert activities add to the Scouting program. Here is an opportunity to build on your HAT outdoor skills and leader training. Expand your knowledge of challenges in the desert and develop the confidence to safely hike, backpack and camp with your unit in the desert.

The course will cover how to explore and enjoy the desert, Subjects covered will deal with building solar stills, geology, plants, animals, weather, health, safety, appropriate food, and all the other things you need to know in order to plan and conduct a safe, rewarding outing in the dry, hot (and cold) desert. Who should attend: Any registered adult. Registration cost: Desert and Astronomy \$35, Astronomy \$15.

Prerequisites: **Completion of the High Adventure Basic Backpack Awareness course.**

When: April 30-May 1, 2011, 7:30 AM. Sat. overnight required in order to receive the Red Rock High Adventure Patch (sorry, Leaders only). Friday overnight with the HAT staff is optional. There will be a beautiful hike up and along one of the Red Rock ridges in camp first thing so please, be on time.

Astronomy Awareness: will begin in the evening (approx.: 7:30 PM; done by 9:30 PM). Bring your binoculars (not required). The HAT Astronomy strip can be earned in this course. You may do the Astronomy Awareness course only, separate from Desert Awareness.

Where: Red Rock Canyon State Park. On HWY 14, past Mojave (north of).

Required to bring: Class A and class B uniform. Current medical, parts A & C. Saturday lunch, dinner and Sunday breakfast, Tour permit, chair, proper clothing (hot days, cold nights), writing instrument, compass, medications, sunscreen, 10 essentials, canteen, daypack for day hike, stove, cook kit & utensils; tent and sleeping gear, if staying overnight. If you stay overnight and help our service project, you can earn the Red Rock Canyon Award. **Camp fee \$25 per night for one vehicle, additional vehicle is \$6. Day use is only \$6, charged by the ranger.** Camp fees subject to change by the State of California

WATER! You will need to bring all the water you need for drinking, cooking and washing with you. No water is available at the Camp Site. Potable water is available at one of the Kybo's.
